National Coaching Development Conference March 2008

Level 2 Development

Change continues as we seek to fit archery coaching into the UK Coaching Model and adapt our coaching, training and qualifications to fit the requirements of the UK Coaching Certificate.

Level 2 training is taking longer to get off the ground than was expected – it had been hoped that the first courses would be starting from 1 April, but delays in producing the resource material have put this back to September this year.

Level 3, meanwhile, is scheduled for introduction in September 2009.

The briefing (roll-out) of Level 2 Lead Tutors and Course Administrators is part complete – the rest is to be done by the end of June.

The coach renewal process is also moving ahead. The intention is to deploy the CPD procedure for coaches and county coaches from July 2008 renewals onwards. The CPD points matrix is (and always has been) available on the GNAS website for those who wish to familiarise themselves with it.

Child Protection Update

The GNAS Child Protection and Vulnerable Adults policy has been reviewed and Bill Mackay gave the updates at this year's coaching development conference. Some new additions and appendices have been added:

Guidelines for allegations added.

How to respond to an allegation, actions to take and avoid.

An Equity policy has added.

Anti-doping policy included.

A 'Whistle blowing' policy.

A Bullying policy.

In the event of an allegation the GNAS are to set up a 'Referral Panel'. This will be convened to give a quick decision on any allegation. The first action is to temporarily suspend the alleged person. They will relinquish their GNAS membership card to the CPO until the matter is resolved.

Guide lines added for Physical contact in sport:

Only use physical contact if the aim is to:

Develop sports skill technique.



To treat an injury.

To meet the requirements of the sport.

Appendix added for injury.

Guidelines for good practice are included for Clubs, Parents and Coaches. These will also include advice on trips, including the minimum number of adults to children

The biggest change of all, after so many people within GNAS have been trained to deliver the Child Protection and Vulnerable Adult policy, is that it now has to delivered by an external body i.e. Sports Coach UK.

Some of these changes are new sections, others are added as appendices.

Paralympic Archery

Ken Kelly gave an insight into coaching elite archers for the Paralympics.

He detailed the medal achievements of the British team at recent Paralympic Games, and showed a series of slides to demonstrate that coaching disadvantaged archers is not so different from coaching able archers. For each individual the coach must guide the participant through a sequence of actions needed to shoot the arrow into the target, using whatever technique is best for the archer.

Whilst there are rules covering the aids allowed at Record Status events, at club level it does not matter if the manner of holding the bow or loosing does not follow the rules, provided safety is maintained. Thus a recurve archer with string hand problems could use a release aid.

Coaches should be looking to make archery accessible to all and not be afraid to innovate.

UKCC Framework

Ollie Holt gave details of progress on the UK Coaching Framework.

The vision is to create a cohesive, ethical, inclusive and valued coaching system where skilled coaches support children, players and athletes at all stages of their development in sport. This should lead to:

- 1 An enhanced quality of coaching at all stages.
- 2 Sustained and increased participation in sport.
- 3 Improved performance.
- 4 A clear career structure for coaches.

He will be holding a series of meetings with Regions and Counties to encourage them to sign up to the UK Coaching Framework. He plans to visit Regions by June 2008, and Counties by November 2008.

DERBYSHIRE

Re-appointment of CCO

Since the last RCO meeting my re-appointment as CCO was accepted at the DCAA AGM held on 9th February 2008.

Winter Coaching

Two more coaching sessions have been held at Staveley. The session on 15th December was for the county squad members and included a Portsmouth qualifier and a Head to Head as well as a talk by Mike Boyce on Drugs in Sport.

The non-squad session on 2nd February included general coaching, videoing and a presentation by Mike Boyce - Concentration and Focus.

The final session is planned for 15th March, again for county squad. Unfortunately this date falls over the same weekend as the Coaching Development Conference to be held at Lilleshall. I only received notice of this conference on the 17th February and so because of this date clash Mike and I will not be able to attend the Staveley session.

Coach Grades/Numbers

The number of coaches in the county has remained the same; 3 County Coaches, 12 coaches and 6 Level 1 coaches.

This event gave CPD points to all who attend including the presenters.

Chris Petchey has arranged a one-day course on teaching/coaching archery for visually impaired people.

The course will be taught by Sue Habgood from the BBS.

Archery Development

The Coaching Group has arranged, and is in the process of running, 2 Archery Training days over the winter of 2008. The first one was held on the 10th February and was attended by 23 Archers. The next one will be held on the 9th March, 25 Archers have already booked. The days are broken down into a number of workshops designed to get the archers to think about the skills required to become a good performer.

It is hoped that with all the new Level 1's and Coaches that the membership of the County archery Society will increase.
